Reading: Mark 14:51-72

Hymn: "Ah, Holy Jesus" (349) vs. 1-2

- Ah, holy Jesus, how hast thou offended that we to judge thee have in hate pretended? By foes derided, by thine own rejected, O most afflicted.
- Who was the guilty? Who brought this upon thee?
 Alas, my treason, Jesus, hath undone thee.
 'Twas I, Lord Jesus, I it was denied thee;
 I crucified thee.

Personal Reflection

Reading: Mark 15:1-20

Hymn: "A Lamb Goes Uncomplaining Forth" (340) vs. 1

 A lamb goes uncomplaining forth to save a world of sinners. He bears the burden all alone, dies shorn of all his honors. He goes to slaughter, weak and faint, is led to die without complaint; his spotless life he offers. He bears the shame, the stripes, the wrath; his anguish, mockery, and death for us he gladly suffers.

Hymn: "Were You There" (353) vs. 1

Reading: Mark 15:40-47




Words of Institution
